# Camp Spotlight

Mary and Winston Marugg

Sonlight is for kids. Founded by Winston and Mary Marugg in 1979, Sonlight is a year round youth camp tucked away in southwestern Colorado. We offer summer camps for individual kids. A couple summer weeks are available for churches to bring their youth and leadership and do their own programming. Our staff guide wilderness backpack trips in July and August for high school groups. Winter brings deep snow, and Sonlight is a ski lodge for youth groups skiing at nearby Wolf Creek ski area.

Sonlight, a great place for kids. A place to get away, face challenges, grow, learn and develop self esteem. Camp is a place where kids can be in the presence of Jesus. Camp is a learning time as we live in community, accepting the challenge of working with others and sharing the good times. Camp is a place to play hard in a safe environment, a place to be still in our fast paced world. Camp is about life, becoming more committed, asking more questions, playing within boundaries and growing to be better people Sonlight is a learning time that will last a lifetime.

To those who come to Sonlight, we say welcome back. Sonlight is a tiny spot of meadow and forest, where our community focuses on teamwork, striving to

accept diversity, and appreciate each individual as a child of God. We intentionally build relationships, and practice skills which enable campers to enrich their families and communities back home.

## 26 Years of History for Sonlight Christian Camp!

Sonlight was incorporated in 1979 as a not-for-profit organization in the state of Colorado. The summers of 1980, 1981, and 1982 were devoted to guiding backpack trips for high school students. In October 1982, 40 acres of land was purchased in the San Juan mountains of Southern Colorado.

Construction began in 1983, along with the sizable projects of water and waste water systems. All the buildings were built with volunteer labor during Memorial Day "barnraising" weekends.

**1979:** Ideas and drawings on a coffee shop napkin

**1982:** Purchase of 40 acres in Hidden Valley Ranch, north of Pagosa Springs

**1983:** The back half of Winchester Cathedral was built. Water and sewage systems installed



**1984:** The main lodge was built

**1985:** Tongue and groove ceilings in the lodge installed

**1986:** Hilton cabin constructed



**1987:** Winchester Cathedral added on to the original bath house

**1988:** The Shop constructed

**1989:** High-Up Regency and Eastin' Westin' built in one weekend

**1990:** One log staff cabin

**1991:** Two log staff cabins

**1992:** The office added onto the lodge

**1993:** Staff room added onto the back of the lodge

**1994:** Two new towers, new deck on the lodge. 40 additional acres of land purchased (adjacent to the original land)

**1995:** Two frame staff cabins; 40 acres purchased along the north end of the west boundary; 4200 gallon water storage tank installed

**1996:** Elk River mobile home installed

**1997:** New deck on Winchester Cathedral and took DOWN the Boulder Building

**1998:** Added a new entrance and a split rail fence, remodeled the Hilton bathroom, added ramp, and completed the Spokes and Oakes Nature Trail

**1999:** Backpacking building constructed and climbing wall was built

**2000:** Major fence reconstruction and new deck on the Hilton Summer 2005 was Sonlight's twenty-sixth season! Little did we know in 1979 that ideas on a coffee shop napkin would grow and last for a quarter of a century. We hoped to backpack in the summer months with a few church youth groups. Work winters at ski areas to pay the bills. Call it a good ministry and be happy. God had other ideas on His own napkin.

**2001:** Year round cabin, staff residence built

**2002:** Steps on the backpack building, and much maintenance!

**2003:** Tongue and groove ceiling in the backpack building, covered deck on the backpack building, and maintenance, new roofing on the Cathedral, reseeded and leveled the meadow

**2004:** Bouldering wall built, "doll house" constructed at the backpack building for restrooms, new round picnic tables as well as major fence reconstruction

**2005:** Dodgeball court and a new roof on the lodge. Replaced a water storage tank collapsed by the winter snow. Adios Elk River! ■

## Day Camp Task Force Update

The Day Camp Task Force continues to make progress! The Task Force was established last year and has been drafting proposed revisions to the State of Colorado School Age Childcare Regulations which Colorado day camps are required to follow. If approved, there would be a separate day camp category with regulations more applicable for day camp programs.

Representatives from the Task Force met with Dana Andrews from the Colorado Department of Human Services on Tuesday, January 10, 2006. It was a productive meeting in which many points of the proposed changes were discussed, as well as the overall need for a Day Camp separation from School Age Childcare. One of the points discussed was how to identify which programs would fall into the proposed Day Camp category. The Task Force suggested that programs could self select which category would be more relevant to their program (school age childcare or day camp).

Dana Andrews also proposed an education session for her program specialists. The session will be held

this year before most camps are visited and will focus on day camps. Although the current regulations will still be in effect, this training will help the program specialists have a greater understanding of day camps and their operations.

The Colorado Parks and Recreation Association (CPRA) has also been working on proposed changes to the current regulations. Representatives from the Day Camp Task Force are meeting with CPRA members in hopes of creating a consolidated revision of the proposed changes to the regulations. The combined efforts of ACA and CPRA will show greater support for the proposed changes, thus increasing the chances for approval by the State. If all continues to move forward smoothly, it is likely the new regulations could be implemented prior to the 2007 camp season.
